

Admissions to B.Tech Programmes

The Joint Seat Allocation Authority (JoSAA) has been set up by the Ministry of Education [erstwhile Ministry of Human Resources Development (MHRD)] to manage and regulate the joint seat allocation for admissions to IITs, NITs, IEST Shibpur, IIITs and Other-Government Funded Technical Institutes (Other-GFTIs). Admission to all the academic programs offered by these Institutes will be made through a single platform. The admission to NITs is based on the performance in Joint Entrance Examination-Main (JEE-Main) conducted by National Testing Agency ([Joint Entrance Examination \(Main\) | India \(nta.nic.in\)](https://jeemain.nta.nic.in)). For candidates to qualify for admission in the IITs/NITS/IIITs and such other CFTIs whose admission is based on JEE ranks, they should have secured at least 75% marks in the 12th Class, or be in the top 20 percentile in the 12th Class exam conducted by the respective Boards (65% for SC/ST/PwD students) (Please visit <https://josaa.nic.in>).
